Vinyl siding is generally considered relatively unserved. One thing that makes it so is the fact that it doesn't have to be painted. It comes with a color mixed with material that is more or less permanent. But over time, the color may disappear, and often unevenly on different parts of the house, due to the different pace of sun exposure. And whether it's gone or not, if you're not the one to choose siding, you might not be crazy about color to begin with. The good news is that you can draw vinyl siding. Just keep in mind that siding will only be as service free as the paint itself. In addition, there are some rules and restrictions to follow when drawing vinyl siding. First and foremost, confirm that painting siding will not be voided by its warranty if the warranty is still active. Even if the warranty allows you to paint, make sure you meet any of the manufacturer's siding conditions, such as the type and color of the paint to use. There are different schools of thought regarding primer. Some pros use it in almost all cases, while many others start with a primer only when it is justified by the condition of siding. For example, a primer may be recommended if the siding is pitted or shows other signs of deterioration or severe weathering. A simple solution is to follow the advice of your paint manufacturer. Keep in mind that the paint sticks to the layer right below it, whether it's naked siding or primer. If you are using a primer, make sure the paint is formulated to stick to it. It is important to understand that vinyl siding is designed to be installed so that it glides slightly back and forth over overlapping seams, moving with the extension and contraction of the material. When siding contracts in cold weather, you can have a small color gap at the seams. Each type of vinyl siding is designed for a certain amount of heat absorption. Because dark colors absorb more heat than light colors, you don't have to choose a paint color that is darker than the original siding color. Manufacturers of high-quality paint offer paints specially designed for vinyl siding, and usually indicate different vinyl safe colors, i.e. colors that will not absorb too much heat. Many vinyl paints are a mixture of urethane and acrylic resins, combining flexibility and excellent adhesion. The dark color can absorb more heat than vinyl siding has been designed for processing, possibly leading to deformation or bucking siding. Laundry detergent General Purpose cleaning of the oxygen powder bleach artist tape Mixing a cleaning solution containing 1/3 cup of powdered washing powder, 2/3 cup of general purpose powdered household cleaner (such as Spic n' Span or Super Washing Soda), and 2/3 cup bleach (such as OxyClean) for every gallon of water. Stir the solution well into a bucket of rinsed with clean water from the garden hose, then hand scrub siding to remove all the dirt, fat, and chalk using brush, sponge or rag. Work from the bottom up, and rinse each section thoroughly immediately after cleaning. Directly flow the water down to prevent getting water per siding. Let the siding dry completely. Manual cleaning makes it much better and safer for siding than washing pressure, which can force water for siding. Use artist tape and camouflage paper or plastic film to mask any areas you don't want to be painted, including doors, windows, trim, and equipment. Apply a primer (if you use one) for all surfaces to be painted using a paint sprayer, roller with a 3/8-inch sleep (for smooth surfaces) cover, roller with 1/2-inch sleep (for rough surfaces) cover, or brush. If you are using a roller or sprayer, always back brush-after roller or sprayer application with brush to provide full coverage and remove drips and heavy areas. Let the primer dry as directed. Paint peeled or primed surfaces with an even layer of outer paint, using the same techniques used for primer. Let the first layer dry for the hiring of a paint manufacturer. Apply the second layer and let it dry. Remove all camouflage materials, and complete any final painting detail and touch windows with a brush. Now his murder case - and potential wrongful conviction became a national conversation. Almost everyone has an opinion about Steven Avery, and most importantly, about whether he actually committed murder. Steven Avery via Netflix via YouTube Who's Steven Avery? The man who eventually became one of the most controversial figures of the 21st century was born on July 9, 1962, making him 56 years old today. He was born in Manitovoc County, Wisconsin, and never left in his life. His parents, Allan and Dolores Avery, owned a 40-acre property and a lifeboat. Steven Avery was one of four children with his siblings Chuck, Earl and Barb. He was not very good at school and then was diagnosed with abnormally low levels of intelligence. According to one of his attorneys later, Steven Avery only functioned with academics and attended school for education with irregularities. How old was Steven Avery the first time he was arrested? In March 1981, when Avery was just 18 years old, he was found guilty of robbing a bar with a friend. His first prison sentence lasted 10 months in the Manitovoc County Jail. Then, shortly after his release, Avery was in trouble again. In 1982, two men accused Avery of forcing them to pour gasoline on the cat and set it on fire. Worryingly, the cat turned out to be a beloved pet belonging to the Avery family. Later, Steven Avery had this to say about his early beliefs: I was young and stupid, and hanging out with the wrong people. When did Steven Avery go to jail? Steven Avery's Making a Murderer via YouTube The first time Steven Avery got sent to prison was for a crime he didn't commit. In 1985, when Avery was 23, a female runner named Penny Birnsen was assaulted, sexually assaulted and beaten while jogging. Avery was found guilty of the crime despite shocking little evidence to convict him. He was sentenced to 32 years in prison. Avery said he was innocent the whole time he was in prison, but it wasn't until the Wisconsin Innocence Project got involved that anyone actually listened to him. Avery was acquitted by DNA evidence and released from prison on September 11, 2003, when he was 41. But he won't be free for long. Steven Avery is jailed again in October 2005, local photographer Teresa Halbach disappeared after a planned meeting with Steven Avery in his rescue yard. Her car was found on his property with blood stains inside him. That along with a mountain of other evidence - including some incriminating elements that were never mentioned during the Netflix documentary The Making of the Killer - led to a conviction. In May 2006, Steven Avery was sent back to prison/ Steven Avery is currently serving a life sentence without the possibility of parole However, his new lawyer Kathleen Selner is motivated to have Steven Avery acquitted again.
